



## Mathematics





- ◆ We are using Florida's new Benchmarks for Excellent Student Thinking (BEST) standards!
- ♦ The students will use MobyMax on the computer to practice mathematics!

### Math Topics Include:

- lacktriangle Number Sense and Operations
  - Ocunting within 120 and skip counting by 2s to 20 and 5s to 100.




